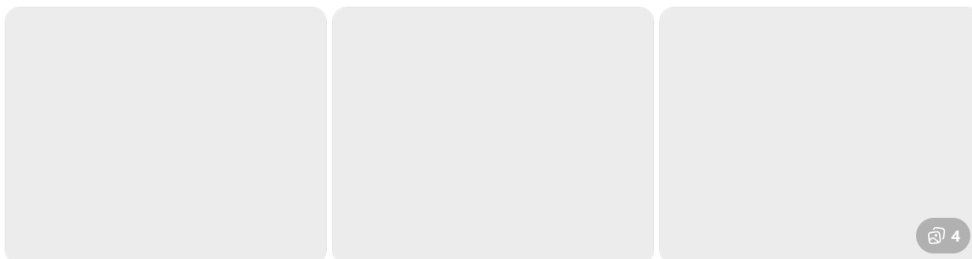
Occupational Therapy Assistant → Therapist

- 💰 £35k–£50k+ Indeed

💻 Client Services / Account Manager



- 💰 £35k–£45k+ Indeed
- Support business clients, manage relationships
- Fast-paced, social, and often includes bonuses

- 💰 £30k → £35k–£50k+
- Help users solve technical issues
- Can be fun if you enjoy **problem-solving + tech**

- Directly help people in real-life situations
- High impact, structured career progression
